singing by the choir and enjoyed joining in the final hymn "Eternal Father Strong to Save". Canon

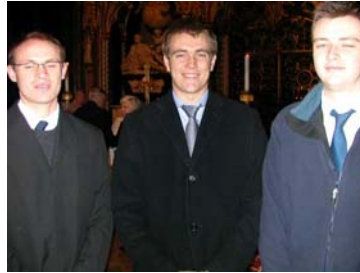
## hmsbarham.com—new website address
